Role Overview

IME is currently hiring for faculty positions for Western music forms such as Acoustic Guitar and Electric Guitar for weekday and weekend batches, online and in-person classes. This role involves:

- orienting towards the education program, designed to align with Trinity College of London for Western music
- assessing student progress and training for musical performances that showcase students' growth and talent.

- This position requires strong communication skills, the ability to manage student behavior, and a collaborative, empathetic spirit to work with educators across artforms.

Through museum education offerings, IME is dedicated to exploring the history, evolution, and contemporary practices of Indian music across the subcontinent. Beyond fostering awareness, the museum creates pathways for audiences to delve deeper into music education through immersive exhibitions, curated programmes, and hands-on learning experiences. Its work spans exhibitions, public programmes, community outreach, and structured educational initiatives that encourage listening, inquiry, and critical engagement with music.

Key Responsibilities

1. Work closely with the Education Manager and Learning Centre Coordinator to help conduct qualitative classes on a regular basis and support the team in planning for musical showcase events, which may be internal and representing IME elsewhere.
2. **Develop lesson plans:** Implement lesson plans that cover music theory and practice
3. **Music classes** - Students are grouped as per learning levels, across age groups starting from 6 years.
4. **Assess student progress.** Evaluate and maintain records student performance on a class-basis and track student progress in areas such as rhythm, pitch, and instrumental skills and train them for Grade assessments
5. **Coordinate musical performances.** Train students for musical showcases that are performance opportunities, honing their skills.
6. **Collaborate with peer educators.** Work with other educators to plan interdisciplinary activities that can enhance learning skills.
7. **Provide feedback.** Offer constructive feedback to students and parents on areas of improvement during the parent-teacher meetings once every 6 months and celebrate student achievements.
8. **Maintain a positive learning environment.** Establish a supportive, empathetic learning environment that encourages creativity, respect, and a love for music.
9. **Prepare instructional materials.** Utilize a variety of instructional materials to accommodate diverse learning styles and promote music appreciation.
10. **Engage in professional development.** Participate in professional development and mentorship programs to stay updated on music education trends for self-growth.
